ADVERT FOR SUBSPECIALIST FELLOWSHIP –

Urogynaecology x2/ Gynae oncology x1 / Feto-maternal x1

Training from current DoH post / Self-Funded / Sponsored Supernumerary Trainee (SA or Foreign qualified)

The above vacant training positions exist as indicated, either in the Durban or Pietermaritzburg complexes under UKZN/DoH-KZN for candidates who may train from an existing DoH service post (as released by their management), or else fully sponsored or self-funded to undertake the required training toward the Fellowships.

The Fellowship in the above sub-disciplines of Obstetrics and Gynaecology are for a TWO-YEAR program as per the approval from HPCSA. An extra year is required by DoH for candidates appointed from regional facilities (i.e. existing service post).

The inherent pre-requisites for the assignment of the numbers are as follows:

Requirements:

- 1) Completed and registered specialist Medical Specialist in Obstetrics and Gynaecology with a FCOG (or equivalent) + MMed (for South African trained specialists)
- 2) Registered / registrable with HPCSA as a specialist

Recommendations:

- 1) 2 years post FCOG qualification
- 2) Supervision of other Masters students
- 3) Research and Publication

Duties (KRA's):

Participate in the clinical and surgical management of general Obstetrics and gynaecology patients as directed by the AHOD and respective head of sub-discipline. The expectation is that for complex case patient management a senior presence is essential for both teaching and learning. Clinical supervision, teaching and assessments of registrars and undergraduate students. Participation in research projects and departmental outreach where relevant. The expectation would be for participation in the call roster as required per institution (at least 16hrs per week inclusive of weekends).

Appointees are allowed to write the respective fellowship exam after completing the 18 months of training as per CMSA regulations. However, readiness to write is at the discretion of the AHOD and the level of competence that the appointee achieves. **Successful candidates will be required to register for MMedSci for the duration of the 24 months of training, as students of UKZN , for degree / non-degree purposes.**

The requirement for acceptance into the program are as follows:

- 1) A written arranged and agreed period of absence from the regional hospital, or
- 2) Sponsored or fully self-funded or with a grant – enough to cover all expected and actual costs for the university, the CMSA, HPCSA and other courses required for exam entry.
- 3) Successful completion of an interview with the program management and UKZN representatives

- 4) Willingness to rotate through the approved training units (IALCH, Durban metro - Complex and PMB-Complex):
- 5) Willingness to return to the country/place of primary appointment at the end of the training period if from a seconded post

4. 3 Referee reports - 2 referee reports from persons affiliated with the University / Hospital where you have worked and one must be from the current line Manager/Supervisor) on letter head and dated
